<u>Rules of Interpretation:</u> Almost as important as the rules of Bible interpretation, are your basic assumptions. When any study the Bible...the skeptic generally starts with the assumption that there are errors in the Bible, and it is the skeptic's role to find these. The objective Christian (on the other hand) accepts that there might appear to be errors or contradictions in the Bible, but starts with the assumption that the Bible is God's word and is not a lie, and thus what may appear as difficulties, given enough information, these can not only be resolved but shown consistent with all logic, history and science.....as it is written- "God's word is truth" Jn. 17:3

Bible Reading- Luke 7:1-10but is not this same account found in Matt 8:5-10, and some feel that this account is also relayed by John in John 4: 43-54.....when we compare these three...we find that Lukes and Matthews accounts match, but there are too many discrepancies with John 4 to suggest that this is a parallel passage of the same miracle....

Luke 7: 1-10

- Now when He concluded all His sayings in the hearing of the people, He entered <u>Capernaum</u>.
- ² And a certain centurion's servant, who was dear to him, was sick and ready to die.
- ³ So when he heard about Jesus, he sent elders of the Jews to Him, pleading with Him to come and heal his servant.

⁴And when they came to Jesus, they begged Him earnestly, saying that the one for whom He should do this was deserving,⁵"for he loves our nation, and has built us a synagogue."

Now when Jesus had entered Capernaum,

a centurion came to Him, pleading with Him,

⁶ saying, "Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed, dreadfully tormented."

7And Jesus said to him, "I will come and heal him." ⁶ Then Jesus went with them.

And when He was already not far from the house, the centurion sent friends to Him, saying to Him,

"Lord, do not trouble Yourself, for I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof.⁷ Therefore I did not even think myself worthy to come to You.

But say the word, and my servant will be healed.⁸ For I also am a man placed under authority, having soldiers under me. And I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does *it*."

⁹ When Jesus heard these things, He marveled at him, and turned around and said to the crowd that followed Him, "I say to you, I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel!" ⁸ The centurion answered and said, "Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof.

But only speak a word, and my servant will be healed.⁹ For I also am a man under authority, having soldiers under me. And I say to this *one*, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does *it*."





On the night of January 22, 1999, Graham Staines had attended a jungle camp, an annual gathering of Christians designed to strengthen and teach local believers.
