#### Call to Himself as the One to be Believed & Followed

Luke 5 **27 ¶** After this, Jesus went out and saw a tax collector by the name of Levi sitting at his tax booth. "Follow me," Jesus said to him, 28 and Levi got up, left everything and followed him. 29 Then Levi held a great banguet for Jesus at his house, and a large crowd of tax collectors and others were eating with them. 30 But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law who belonged to their sect complained to his disciples, "Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and 'sinners'?" **33** They said to him, "John's disciples often

fast and pray, and so do the disciples of the Pharisees, but yours go on eating and drinking."

#### Call to Himself as the One to be Believed & Followed

Luke 5:30 The Pharisees and their scribes began grumbling at His disciples, saying, "Why do you eat and drink with the tax collectors and <sup>[]</sup>sinners?" <sup>31</sup> And Jesus answered and said to them, <u>"It is not those who are well who need</u> <u>a physician, but those who are sick. <sup>32</sup> I have not come</u> to call the righteous but sinners to repentance." Call to Himself as the One Who Brings the New (Again)

<sup>33</sup> And they said to Him, "The disciples of John often fast and offer prayers, the disciples of the Pharisees also do <sup>[]</sup>the same, but Yours eat and drink." <sup>34</sup> And Jesus said to them, <u>"You cannot make the <sup>[]</sup>attendants (Lit, sons) of the bridegroom fast while the bridegroom is with them, can you? <sup>35</sup> But the days will come; and when the bridegroom is taken away from them, then they will fast in those days."</u> Jesus' Wakeup Call to Engage in His New

<sup>36</sup> And He was also telling them a parable: "No one tears a piece of cloth from a new garment and puts it on an old garment; otherwise he will both tear the new, and the piece from the new will not match the old.



<sup>37</sup> And no one puts new wine into old wineskins; otherwise the new wine will burst the skins and it will be spilled out, and the skins will be ruined. <sup>38</sup> But new wine must be put into fresh wineskins. <sup>39</sup> And no one, after drinking old wine wishes for new; for he says, 'The old is good enough.'" NASB
