



Synthesis of these three accounts-

Now when Jesus had crossed over again by boat to the other side, a great multitude gathered to Him; and He was by the sea. And behold, an official of Israel, one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name came. He begged Him earnestly, saying, "My little daughter lies at the point of death. Come to my house, for she is an only daughter, twelve years of age, and she is dying." So Jesus arose and followed him, as did His disciples." (then you have the interuption of the women with the issue of blood) While He was still speaking, some came from the ruler of the synagogue's house who said, "Your daughter has died. Why trouble the Teacher any further?" As soon as Jesus heard the word that had been spoken, He said to the ruler of the synagogue, "Do not be afraid; only believe." She will be made well." Jairus fell at His feet and worshipped Him, saying,

"Even if My daughter has just now died, you come and lay Your hand on her and she shall live. And Jesus permitted no one to follow Him except Peter, James, and John the brother of James and the father and mother of the girl. Then He came to the house of the ruler of the synagogue, and saw the crowds and those who wept and wailed loudly. He said to them, "Leave, for this little girl is not dead, but is sleeping." And they scorned Him with laughter, ridiculing Him. When He had put them all outside. He then took the father and the mother of the child, and those who were with Him, and entered where the child was lying. But He took her by the hand and called, saying, "Talitha, cumi," or "Little girl, arise." Then her spirit returned, and she arose immediately and walked, for she was twelve years of age. And they were overcome with great amazement. But He commanded them strictly that no one should know it, and that something should be given her to eat.

- a. All Sickness ultimately the result of sin...Gen. 3:16-To the woman He said: "I will greatly multiply your sorrow and your conception; in pain you shall bring forth children..."Romans 5: 12 There, just as through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned..
- **b. Sickness can be related to Demons-Mark 1:32** At evening, when the sun had set, they brought to Him all who were **sick** and those who were **demon-possessed.** 34 Then He healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons; and He did not allow the demons to speak, because they knew Him.
- c. Sickness can be the result of Satans afflictions see Job 1....Job was perfect...yet he had boils...and great destruction.....

d. Sickness can be disciplinary from God-1 Cor. 11:30 this reason many are weak and sick among you, and many sleep

e. Sickness can be so that the glory of God is revealed-

Jn. 9....man born blind who sinned? neither...but that the glory of God is revealed....

aa The Ruler came to the right Person- he came to Jesusbehold there came one, a official of Israel

bb. The Ruler came worshiping- a official of Israel who fell down and worshipped Him, saying...prostrated himself on the ground....the one thing most people seek for today is fame and attention....The word worship-found 66 x in KJV.....translated bowed low, or prostrated or worshiped...First mention Gen. 24:26 Then the man bowed down his head and the LORD. And I bowed my head and the LORD, and blessed the LORD God of my master Abraham, who had led me in the way of truth"

cc. The Ruler came Requesting or Praying

dd. The ruler kept on with the walking towards home...knowing that the child was dead.

ee. The Ruler kept right on believing.

ff. The Ruler came WITH RESURRECTION FAITH- "My daughter has just now died, but come and lay Your hand on her and she shall live."you must believe Jesus can make you alive...and you must act upon your belief...ie come, cast, call, and care....about Jesus.

How did Jesus Speak of starting a Relationship with the Him?

a. Be His Disciple-He called Peter, James, John, Nathanel, and all the disciples with the words "Come, follow me!" Mt. 9:9

Disciples first called Christians at Antioch. Acts 11:26





B. Jesus Spoke of Relationship as a new member of his family "become a His child....a child of God"

Matthew 5: Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.

John 1:12 But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name:

C. Jesus Spoke of relationship as a new birth...to be born again.

John 3:7 "Do not be surprised when I say to you that you need to be born again."

1Pet. 1:23 "Being born again not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the Word of God, which lives and abides forever."



D. 2 Cor. 5:17: Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become

new



E. This relationship is described as a fruitful tree-

Mt. 7:17-19 Even so every good tree brings forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree brings forth evil fruit. 18. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that brings not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire 20 Wherefore by their fruits you shall know them.



F. This relationship is described as a new house ...dwelling for Holy Spirit

1 Cor 3:16 Know not that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?

1 Cor. 6:19 "What? Do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost, which is in you, which you have of God?"
