

And the evil spirit answered and said, "Jesus I know, and Paul I know; but who are you?"



- 1:9 Christ purposed in himself to reveal to us the mystery of his will.
- 1:10 Christ would gather together in one all things in Christ, both of which are in heaven and on earth, in Him. He repeats it twice in the same sentence for emphasis.
