

How Do We Recognize Jesus Today?

Question - How would you react if Jesus were to walk in here this morning?

- Would I even recognize Him?
- And if I did, would I:
 - respond in terror?
 - run away?
 - respond in joy and delight at the thrill of seeing Him?
 - be looking to see the physical evidences of His crucifixion?
 - bow in worship?
 - greet Him as my dearest Friend?

An Unexpected Encounter with Jesus

That very day two of them were going to a village named Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, and they were talking with each other about all these things that had happened. While they were talking and discussing together, Jesus himself drew near and went with them. But their eyes were kept from recognizing him. And he said to them, “What is this conversation that you are holding with each other as you walk?” And they stood still, looking sad. Then one of them, named Cleopas, answered him, “Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?”

Lk 24:13-18 (ESV)

And he said to them, “What things?” And they said to him, “Concerning Jesus of Nazareth, a man who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, and how our chief priests and rulers delivered him up to be condemned to death, and crucified him. But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things happened. Moreover, some women of our company amazed us. They were at the tomb early in the morning, and when they did not find his body, they came back saying that they had even seen a vision of angels, who said that he was alive. Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but him they did not see.” Lk 24:19-24 (ESV)

And he said to them, “O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?” And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself. So they drew near to the village to which they were going. He acted as if he were going farther, but they urged him strongly, saying, “Stay with us, for it is toward evening and the day is now far spent.” So he went in to stay with them.

Lk 24:25-29 (ESV)

When he was at table with them, he took the bread and blessed and broke it and gave it to them. And their eyes were opened, and they recognized him. And he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, “Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the Scriptures?”

Lk 24:30-32 (ESV)

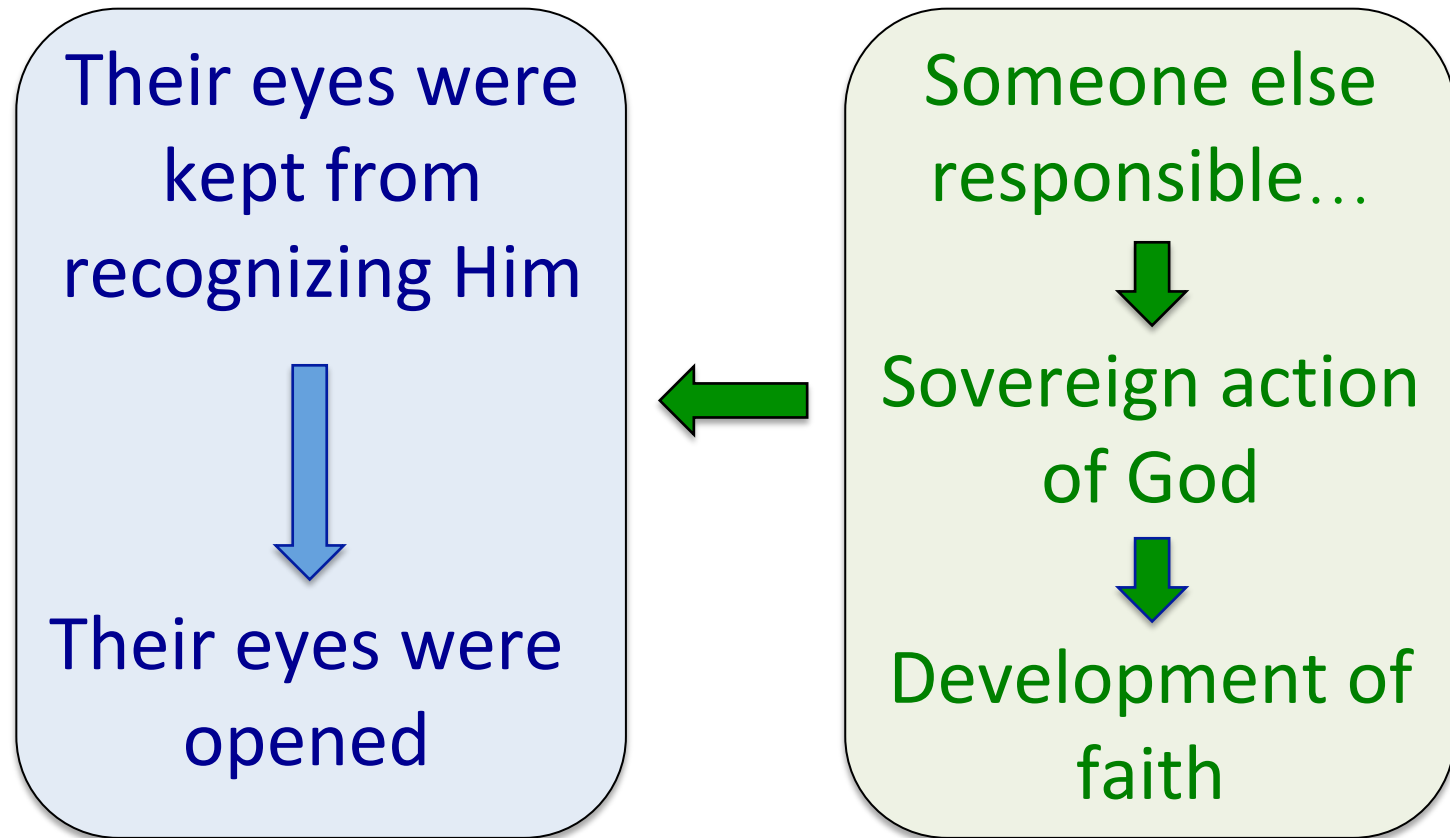
Cleopas and his Friend...

- Jesus caught up with and walked with them.
- ***their eyes were kept from recognizing him***
 - They likely shared meals and talks
 - They know a great deal about Jesus
 - They mentioned their feelings about Him
 - They knew the cold, hard facts about Jesus

...beginning with Moses and all the Prophets,
he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the
things concerning himself Lk 24:27 (ESV)

How Can We Recognize Jesus Today?

- a shared meal... thanksgiving prayer, Jesus broke the bread and gave it to them...
- ***their eyes were opened, they recognized him***



A Clue from Jesus

When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. Before him will be gathered all the nations, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. And he will place the sheep on his right, but the goats on the left. Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.

Acts of Kindness (primarily to other believers)

- = acts of kindness to Jesus Himself
- People's suffering is His suffering
- Compassion shown to people is compassion shown to Jesus

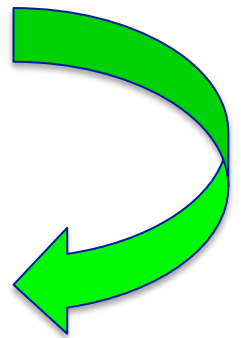
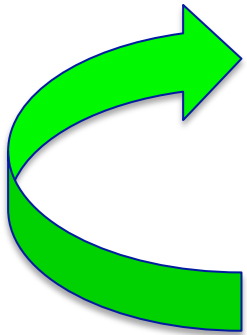
Let Us Do Good

Ambassadors for Christ

a world in desperate need**

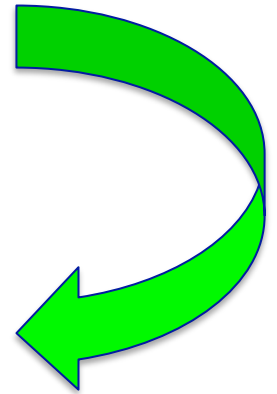
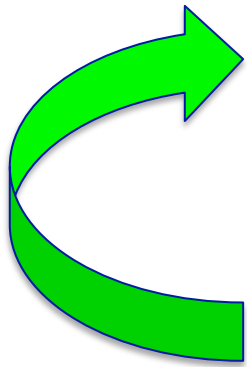
Job Description


- Show kindness and generosity to people in need.
